Some Information on Science Camp

CABIN ASSIGNMENTS & TEACHING GROUPS:

There will be six to seven students and one chaperone to every cabin (four bunk beds); and three cabin groups for each teaching group (1 naturalist, 3 to 4 chaperones and 18 to 21 students).

MEDIC:

Alliance Redwoods provides a Medic who is available 24 hours/day. All medications, must be turned in to Eich Middle School before November 14, 2017. All information will be sent to parents well in advance of the trip. Our nursing staff will check in all medications and verify doctor orders before the trip.

MEALS:

Bus drivers and additional parent drivers eating meals at camp (especially Friday lunch) must be pre-arranged. Please pre-pay at camp office. All students, chaperones and teacher meals are included. However, you must bring a sack lunch for Tuesday, November 14^{+} only.

SCHOOL PHOTO:

An Outdoor Education school photo will be taken during the week. We will provide ordering information before the trip.

TELEPHONES:

The camp has payphones available; however, it is the school's decision as to whether students will be given access to the payphones during free time. (Cell phones do not work in camp.) For Emergency phone calls, please dial (707) 874-3507 ext. "101".

Step 3: Call made to the parents

Step 4: Sent home at parental expense
